
TIME IS ESSENCE

Ecclesiastes 3:1-8


This was written by Solomon, the son of David.

The Hebrew term Qoheleth (translated as "the teacher") suggests someone who aggregates something.




Solomon was teaching from the depth of experience and not just a mere theory.

Ecc. 1:1 "The words of the Teacher, son of David, king in Jerusalem".



The book of Ecclesiastes contains the thoughts of "the Philosopher," a man who reflected deeply on how short and contradictory human life is and he could not understand the ways of God, who controls human destiny.



We all may work the same hours but earn a different salary. We may all attend the same event but eat a different meal. Twins may be born on the same day but die on a different day.

1. Humans have time in their hands.

Human's View of Time: **Two schools of thoughts** 2. Time is so fixed – The fatalistic view: The term "fatalism" can refer to any of the following ideas: Any view according to which human beings are powerless to do anything other than what they do and demonstrating a

Human's View of Time: **Two schools of thoughts** 2. Time is so fixed – The fatalistic view: belief that all events are inevitable, so one's choices and actions make no difference. A fatalistic view denies the possibility of free will. This is where you have the idea of Good luck (never in the dictionary of a believer).

Believers View of Time

As believers, we are to balance both ideologies and not be on either extreme. Our stand should be like that of Solomon in Eccl 3.

Believers View of Time

The Good news Bible gave us the best interpretation of Eccl 3 and the side of "Time" we should take.

Everything that happens in this world happens at the time God chooses.

2 He sets the time for birth and the time for death, the time for planting and the time for pulling up,

the time for killing and the time for healing, the time for tearing down and the time for building.

4 He sets the time for sorrow and the time for joy, the time for mourning and the time for dancing,

the time for making love
and the time for not making
love, the time for kissing
and the time for not kissing.

6 He sets the time for finding and the time for losing, the time for saving and the time for throwing away,

7 the time for tearing and the time for mending, the time for silence and the time for talk.

8 He sets the time for love and the time for hate, the time for war and the time for peace.



GOD SETS THE TIME (He chooses the time) and we are stewards of the set time, therefore what matters is what to do with God's given time he has placed before us.

What's the Keyword?

1. Solomon portrayed the pattern of human life in the event of time, having a mixture of the good and the bad and the ups and the down.

2. Nothing is permanent and nothing can last forever.

2 Corinthians 4:18 "So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal".

Only God is not bound by time: 3. 2 Peter 3:8 "But do not overlook this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day".

3. Only God is not bound by time: Rev 22:13 "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End".

WITHIN TIME & OUR RESPONSE:

CHANCE CHOICE PURPOSE



Have you heard this phrase before *"It's one of those things"?*

CHANCE

Astrologists believe that a force usually decides if good luck or bad luck will happen to someone but this is not a Christian language.



We are tempted to take laws into our hands and say *"I will decide my fate".*

CHOICE

Luke 12:19-21 (NIV) 19 "And I'll say to myself, "You have plenty of grain laid up for many years. Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry."

CHOICE

Luke 12:19-21 (NIV) 20 "But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?"

CHOICE

Luke 12:19-21 (NIV) 21 "This is how it will be with whoever stores up things for themselves but is not rich toward God."

PURPOSE

God is a purposeful God, he doesn't do anything without any reason, we can either respond to him or neglect him. In mourning, there is a purpose, in singing, there is a purpose, etc.



"Lord, what do you want me to do within these seasons you have set"?

Unbelievers Approach to Time

Rejoices in the good events of life, praises God in the difficult seasons of life and learn from God's perspective.

Believers Approach to Time

To fear God who set the bad and the good time.

Eccl. 3:14

I know that everything God does will endure forever; nothing can be added to it and nothing taken from it. God does it so that people will fear him.

The best car, the most beautiful woman/handsome man, loads of money in your bank account, etc, nothing can satisfy the longing soul of a man except God.

Eccl 3:11 He has made everything beautiful in its time. He has also set eternity in the human heart; yet no one can fathom what God has done from beginning to end.

Depreciation may be defined as the permanent decrease in the value of an asset through wear and tear in use or the passage of time. Only the work of God is permanent, needs no modification, revaluation, impairments, etc.

Your best car of 2 years ago, is now an old model.
