29 "Immediately after the distress of those days "the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light; the stars will fall from the sky, and the heavenly bodies will be shaken.'



30 "Then will appear the sign of the Son of Man in heaven. And then all the peoples of the earth will mourn when they see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of heaven, with power and great glory.



31 And he will send his angels with a loud trumpet call, and they will gather his elect from the four winds, from one end of the heavens to the other. 32"Now learn this lesson from the fig tree: As soon as its twigs get tender and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near.



33 Even so, when you see all these things, you know that it is near, right at the door.

34 Truly I tell you, this generation will certainly not pass away until all these things have happened. 35 Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away.



36 "But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. 37 As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. 38 For in the days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark;



39 and they knew nothing about what would happen until the flood came and took them all away. That is how it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. 40 Two men will be in the field; one will be taken and the other left. 41 Two women will be grinding with a hand mill; one will be taken and the other left.



42 "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come.




I. Jesus promised His return (24:1-3).

- He foretells the future while speaking to his disciples on the Mount of Olives.
- His return is imminent (24:32-35)

Two Questions: a) "When?"

b) "What will be the sign of your coming and the end of the age?"



Note: 24:2 This prophecy of Jesus was fulfilled by the Roman prince Titus, who destroyed the temple in the Roman war of AD 67-70. In about AD 135, the emperor Hadrian completely destroyed the city of Jerusalem and built a new city on its foundation and named it AeliaCapitolina.

II. The signs of Christ Streturn (24:4-14).

- •A time of apostasy (24:4-5, 11)
 •A time of anarchy (24:6-8)
- •A time of sorrows and natural disasters (7b)
- •A time of affliction (24:9-10)
- •A time of apathy (24:12-13)
- A time of accomplishment (24:14)
 The gospel will be preached to all nations.



III. The Time of Ghrist Return (27-34)

- •No one knows the day your Lord will come (42).
- •The Father knows when? (36-40)
- It will surely happen in God's appointed time!



IV. The Challenge of Christ Return (42-51)

•Understanding is crucial.
•Because of God's word, we are 100% certain of what is to come.
•It looks like the Kingdom of God is losing, quite the opposite.
•Jesus is working on a heavenly timeline! He is on time.

V. How shall I prepare for Christ's return?

- •You cannot afford not to be shortsighted at the same time, farsighted.You need both types of vision!
- •Develop a missional spirituality.
- •Use what is temporary to prepare that which is permanent.
 - •Be alert!
 - •Be ready!
 - •Be prepared!
